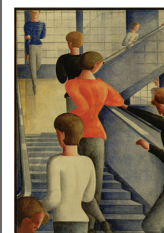

About the Cover

Initially a sculptor and later a stage designer, Schlemmer was interested in the human figure and its relationship to the space around it. He rejected the pure abstraction popular at the time, preserving the physical structure of the body and exploring every movement that the body could make. In this famous work, he is a choreographer; human bodies in motion become architectural forms, in a rhythmic collaboration with the staircase. According to art critic John-Paul Stonard, "The yellow floor on which the dancer is posed en pointe has been tilted towards the viewer . . ."
